Victorian History

H1. Victorian Parlor Games

Recommended for 1st-4th grade

Step back in time to play parlor games the way wealthy Victorian children did.

- What differences & similarities are there in houses of the past & of today?
- What were Victorian expectations of children?
- What games did children enjoy?

H2. Victorian Inventions

Twentieth Century Inventions (1895-1925)

Recommended for 3rd -5th grade

Experience the excitement of “new” inventions of the Victorian past & learn to think like an inventor.

- Do we use any items that were invented during 1895-1925?
- What differences came about because of these inventions?
- How would life be without those items today?

H3. Victorian Manners

Recommended for K-3rd grade

Practice your Victorian Parlor Etiquette (Manners) & create your own calling card.

- Are there similarities to what we wear now?
- Where did some of our manners come from?
- How does what we wear affect what we can do?

H4. Victorian Architecture

Art & Architecture

Recommended for 5th -7th grade

Become an Architect & design a house.

- What is architecture & what does an architect do?
- How did the industrial age & manufacturing affect house building?
- What does it take to be a Queen Anne Style house?

Art Discovery

A1. Art-Geography & Fashion

Recommended for 3rd -7th grade

Discover Elizabeth Rahr’s dolls from around the world & learn to create your own Clothespin or Paper Doll.

- How & why did the creation of paper dolls start?
- What other types of dolls are there?
- What are some of the stories behind the Dolls?

A2. Art-Marc Chagall

Recommended for 5th grade & above

Why did the chicken go to Chagall’s Circus? Find out why chickens, goats, & violins appear in artist Marc Chagall’s Prints.

- How can when & where you are born affect your art
- What can symbols in art works mean?
- How are prints made?

A3. Art -Landscape-Seascape

Recommended for all ages

No more flat artwork, give your artwork depth.

- How do artists create depth?
- What types of symbols can artists use to communicate?
- How & why can you group certain types of art?

A4. Art-Surrealism & Salvador Dali

Recommended for 5th grade & above

“To Paste”; learn some French while exploring a Spanish Artist.

- What is a collage?
- What is surreal art & how does it differ from realistic art?
- What are the characteristics of surreal art?

A5. Déjà Vu-Repeating shapes

Recommended for 3rd grade & above

Create a block print. Concepts: block print, pattern, repetition, overlap, rotation, color

A6. You can see yourself!

Self Portrait

Recommended for 2nd grade & above

Use a mirror to draw & enhance your Reflection. Concepts: self portrait, line, shape.

A7. What Size is it?

Recommended for 3rd grade & above

Create a collage with depth from a collection image. Concepts: size, depth, detail.

A8. Tape Shapes

Recommended for K-2nd grade

Explore shape & line an easy way.

Concepts: line, shape, color

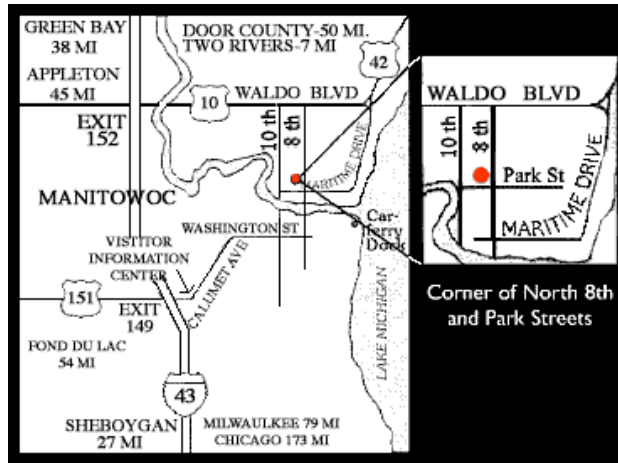
